








DORPSSTRAAT 1965



DORPSSTRAAT TODAY






ISSUES AT PLAY

- No recorded crashes
- Perceived level of risk
- Mostly from children & elderly
- Political pressure to remove bicycles from the street





GUIDELINES

- CROW research
- Always allow bicycles if:
 - <100 peds/hour/meter</p>
- If > 100 but <160
 - Introduce central cycling area
- If > 160 but < 200
 - Introduce kerbs
- If > 200
 - Re-route cyclists





EXAMPLE: HAARLEM

- 2 parallel shopping streets
- One allowed, one disallowed cycling
- Central cycling area





EXAMPLE: THE HAGUE

- High volume of peds + bikes
- Through route to the station
- Kerb-separated "bicycle lane"
- Doesn't allow for crossing movements
- Conflicts at intersections



CAVEATS

- Available width
- Type of cyclists
 - Through-traffic vs customers!
- Available re-routing options



| 0 - 1 km | 26% |

LOCAL CONTEXT

- Hot topic: 1200 survey results
- 1 in 4 visitors live within walking distance
- 86% of people get annoyed with bicycles(!)
- By far most people cycle or walk to the shops







€35 per visit

€49 per visit

47% visits weekly

18% visits weekly

SOLUTIONS

- Political solution: Ban cyclists
- Popular solution: Ban cyclists
- Not popular with:
 - Retailers(!)
 - School children
 - Cycling federation
- Providing a safe, comfortable alternative is expensive



PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT

- 120 people at public event
- Still difference of opinion

"You really have to watch out in this street. You could easily lose your life."





PROPOSED SOLUTION

- Step 1: Optimise cross section
 - Move signage
 - Create less linear design
- Step 2: Awareness campaign
- Step 3: Provide alternatives





KEY LESSONS

- No evidence of safety issue
- Perceived safety of leisure shoppers
- 3. Design matters
- 4. Cyclists are customers
- 5. Provide alternative route
- **6.** Default should be: cyclists allowed, unless...
