

Urbanisation effects in India




- India is experiencing unprecedented growth.





What makes HMR unique? Project Insights...

- ❖ To handle 1.8 million passengers per day by 2018 & 2.2 million per day by 2024.
- ❖ To be partly commissioned by 2016.
- ❖ Total cost of US \$2.25 billion.
- Not a simple Metro, but an urban redesign & rejuvenation effort to transform Hyderabad into a people friendly green city.














Global Framework by UN-Habitat




